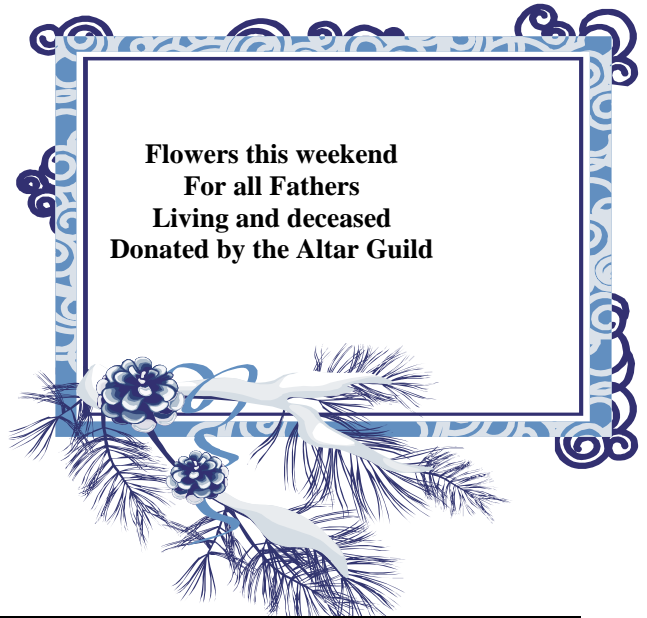

2008-2009 Bible Study – The Gospel of John will be the focus of our Adult Bible Study beginning in September. 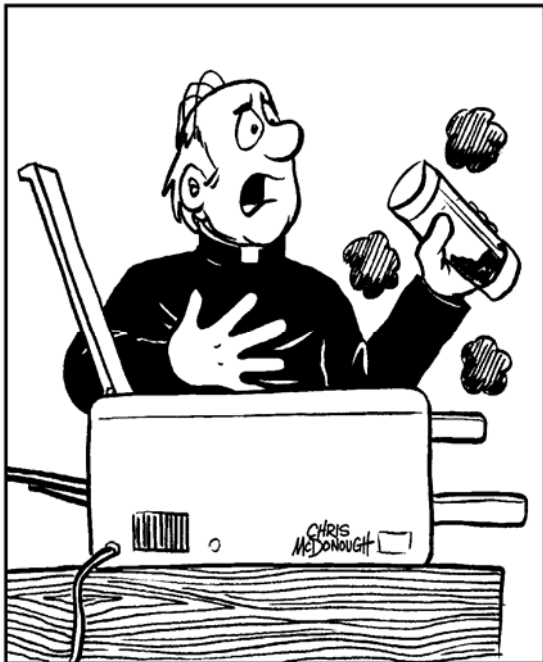
